Water Woes in Cohasset

Well, (no pun intended), it's September and wells are dry and drying up all over the hill. The steady stream of water trucks going up and down the hill make me a little nervous because even though my well still pumps, it could go dry any day now. Here's some info I found this week:

As of August 24, there are only 4 dry wells reported in Cohasset. Only. Four.

“Interim Director of Water and Resource Conservation Christina Buck, says reporting dry wells helps the county pursue money and drought programs and direct those resources to the right places.

Right now, the county is working on establishing a water filling station and emergency water program in the Chico area where people can fill their own containers with potable water. Buck says that should be up and running very soon.” (<https://krctv.com/news/local/butte-county-tackles-the-drought-as-conditions-worsen>)

So, if everyone up here on the hill were to report their dry or failing wells, we might have a chance to get the feds to take notice. Until then, we will hopefully get some help from the county. Now I understand that Cohassians are some of the toughest critters on the planet, but next to beer, water is our most important commodity.

PGE Generator Rebate Program.

Thinking about buying a new generator, or replacing old Sparky? PG&E has a generous generator rebate program that will be offered until the end of the year or until they run out of money. A list of qualifying products and general information is on their website at pge.com.

Search for:

PGE Residential Generator and Battery Rebate Program

- a. Level 1 is a \$300 Rebate for a Product purchased between \$0-\$500.
- b. Level 2 is a \$500 Rebate for a Product purchased between \$501-\$1,000.
- c. Level 3 is a \$1,000 Rebate for a Product purchased \$1,001 and above. Any Rebate amount cannot exceed the purchase price of the product, nor can it include taxes or shipping costs. However, Customers who participate in PG&E's California Alternate Rates for Energy Program or Family Electric Rate Assistance Program can receive an additional \$200 if the total Rebate amount which includes the applicable Level amount, does not exceed the qualifying Product's purchase price.
