Why Do Leaves Change Colors in the Fall?

I lived in the Midwest and the East for 20 years and have been blessed to see some of the most beautiful fall tree color displays. While we don't have the variety of trees such as sugar and red maples that really light up the landscape, we do have some

color from the dogwoods and oaks that brighten up our autumn.

But what causes trees to change colors in the fall? It's not the oncoming of cold weather as many imagine. It all has to do with day length. In fact cold weather has very little to do with color change. It can spoil the fall tree color display, because an early freeze may kill the leaves, causing them to turn brown and fall without a spectacular color change.

Here's what really happens: In late summer, as daylight hours

shorten and temperatures cool, the veins that carry fluids into and out of the leaf are gradually closed off as a layer of special cork cells forms at the base of each leaf. As this cork layer develops, water and mineral intake into the leaf is reduced, slowly at first, and then more rapidly. It is during this time that the green chlorophyll in the leaf begins to decrease.

A leaf is green because of the presence of a pigment known as chlorophyll. Chlorophyll is abundant in the leaf's cells during the growing season and its green color dominates and masks out the colors of any other pigments that may be present in the leaf. As the chlorophyll degrades, the hidden pigments of yellow and orange that were present in the leaves during the summer are revealed.

There are additional pigments in the leaves during the summer that contribute to other colors when chlorophyll goes away such as (careful, two big botanical words follow) carotenoids, which give carrots their orange color and provides yellow, brown, orange color to the leaves, and anthocyanins, which provide the reds and the purples. Anthocyanins' pigments often combine with the carotenoids' colors to create the deeper orange, fiery reds, and bronzes typical of many hardwood species you find in the maples of the Midwest and East.

Can there be better fall color displays in some years than others? You bet. The brightest colorations usually develop when the sunlight in autumn is bright and the days are cool, but the nights are chilly and above freezing.




The State has passed some new building codes for new construction and for substantial remodels. After January 1, fire sprinkler and carbon monoxide detectors will be required for all new construction.

Police Beat

Over the last several months and as recent as the end of November, there have been several vehicle accidents involving the suspicion of driving under the influence of marijuana. These accidents have led to several North State deaths and tragedy for several families.

In July 2010, a very well liked school teacher lost her life while jogging, to a driver accused of being under the influence of marijuana while driving. Within a couple of weeks, the driver's girlfriend would be arrested after being accused of selling marijuana in order to obtain funds to post her boyfriend's bail and lawyer fees. She too is still in custody and both await further court appearances.

Unlike alcohol, marijuana does not have a "legal limit," meaning that there is no set standard on what constitutes being under the influence of marijuana. With alcohol, we know that if you are over .08 percent you could be arrested for driving under the influence.

Hopefully in the near future this state can change this by enacting law that would give the public guidance in what is considered being under the influence of marijuana. You would think that common sense would dictate that one would not get behind the wheel; however, people do not think as clearly after smoking marijuana.

I would hope the public would be all for this since it is you, your family and friends who are on those roads too. Making a death notification to a family member is one of the worst duties I have as a Deputy Sheriff.

The School Acquisition Committee recently met with the Chico Unified School District Superintendent and staff to discuss the status of the May CCA proposal to lease the old school. The CCA Board proposal is to lease the site to be used as a park and community center. It was generally agreed that the Cohasset School site should be used for some type of public function and that it is not likely that a valley charter school would be interested in the property. The district was recently advised by legal counsel that there are several procedural steps to follow should the school board choose to offer the property for lease. Among other things these steps include a requirement for the school district to form an advisory committee, notify other public agencies and other non-profits of the building availability and publicly advertise for lease proposals. CUSD staff has now agreed to move the process forward and will provide the CCA with a written outline of the steps and estimated timeframes necessary to allow for school board consideration to consider leasing the facility after the upcoming holiday season. While we look forward to finally getting the process in gear, we will now likely miss the deadline to apply for the specific parks grant money we were hoping for. We will continue to look for other funding sources for this and other future community needs. The CCA will continue to work with the school district and keep the community informed.


Cohasset Brew Club
